





Generally activities happen on weekends (Saturdays)

• Exam oriented preparations include – subject coaching, preparing examination papers, reviewing the answers, exam counselling, motivational talks, etc.

- 2. Yoga, meditation, Value education, and other specific workshops
- 3. Need-based & Sponsor-based infrastructure support, etc.
- 4. Disaster management support e.g. Chennai/ Kodagu/ Kerala/Karnataka Flood relief, Pandemic support




- Saadhana Annual school kit events @ 10+ schools Providing school bags, uniform, shoes, stationery, note books, geometry box, crayons, practice sheets, water bottle etc to 2000 students@ Rs 1000 per kit = 20 lakhs
- Pravas Excursion for rural children(Pravas) Rs. 3 lakhs
- Spoorthi Talent based competitions in areas of culture, literature and sports for rural and needy children – Rs 2 lakhs
- Saadhya / Teaching activities in BR Hills (tribal) Rs 1 lakh
- Exam counseling/ Preparation for students Rs 1 lakh
- Teacher's training Rs 2-3 lakhs
- Language Lab installations and maintenance Rs 5 Lakhs for 3 schools
- Vidya Nidhi Based on donor's response - around 10 lakhs

Important Discussion:

ground-zero challenges in RTG education

Students' perspective

- "If happiness is the end result of education, why do we need to come to school, we are already happy" – told by RTG children
 - Challenge: Unaware of importance of formal education at different stages in life & hence it is not a priority task during formative years
- "We have always come from 5th to 9th automatically, why these examinations in 10th?"
 - Challenge: Weak basics in all subjects, leading to teaching & learning challenges in higher standards
- "I am a fish. Why are you teaching me and assessing me on how fast I can climb a tree."
 - Challenge at education system: Lack of persona based, learner based, student based, objective based, teaching-assessment and certifying system. 10th standard is not same for all children. So, the assessments should be different for different system. (Similar to NIOS system)

Teachers' perspective

- ">50% of our time is spent on administrative work. (updating portals, apps, attending meetings, engaging officials, visitors, etc.). How do we retain energy for quality teaching?"
 - Separate staff unavailable for clerical tasks. Teachers multiply as admin staff, house-keeping staff, PR staff, etc.
- "These kids don't respond. They are lazy."
 - Lack of motivation in long-term/Senior teachers to repeat the same lessons and engage children in multiple ways. Learner based teaching to be implemented.
- "For this salary, even my maid doesn't work"
 - In non-governmental institutions, teachers are paid minimum, even though donors are available to support. (due to long-term commitment issues, multiple-requirement issues etc.)

Institutions/ Management

- "Most important support required is Infrastructure"
 - Institutions & management are focused on buildings, facilities, CCTVs, benches, infrastructure, computer block, smart-class, brand-building, compliances and other similar aspects. Providing, high-quality, engaging, education come later in the list.
- "Who will lead after me?"
 - Lack of succession planning, lack of visionary succeeding leaders, leading to massive drop in numbers and quality of students
- "Attrition-rate, Motivation and retention of teachers"

Well-wishers

- "Just by exam-oriented/ marks-oriented preparations and by making them clear 10th standard examination, are you helping them or spoiling them?"
 - Clearing 10th std makes them eligible to Job-oriented courses, ITI diploma or other activities. Without 10th, they are not accepted by the society, and they end up in wrong company and wrong habits.

NGOs

- "Interested volunteers vs committed resources"
 - Genuinely interested volunteers support in sporadic events.
 Consistent, committed, experienced, matured, affectionate, empathetic teachers (resources) who can 'bridge the existing gaps' unavailable, even on remunerative basis
- "Top 3 activities on which <u>time being spent by NGO</u>
 <u>representatives -</u> Compliances, volunteer & staff co ordinations and donor information"
 - "Top 3 activities on which time <u>should be spent</u> are Education, Quality education and High-quality, engaging education"

ALL

- "<u>Digital-education</u>— has not penetrated deeply into the system. Tablets, videos are rarely used by students on own"
 - Teachers may use the videos to support their teaching. But videos or digital aids by themselves may not be useful fully by students themselves.

Causes:

- videos are at general level,
- students' knowledge is different,
- their interest is low etc.
- Parents support is not there.
- NGO are intermittently using these to support the teaching system. It is only partially effective, cannot substitute mainstream, direct, face to face teaching.

Few actions initiated by Aapatsahaaya team to address these challenges/learnings

- Having separate strategy and implementation for the 4 type of projects: sadhana, saadhya, SSS and disaster support.
 - Sadhana gives entry, Saadhya helps improve quality of education
 - Sanskrit & Culture for Rural: to enhance basic knowledge of words, confidence, memory, valueeducation and spirituality
- Explaining importance of education to students and parents
- **3 layered seva-workforce:** volunteers, paid-freelancers, project-based experts & vendors (10th std teachers, website development, student counsellors, preparatory question papers, school kit & tour events, etc.)
- Round the year, variety engagement to address areas of different students and teachers.
- **long-term adoption:** Schools like Tyamagondlu, BR Hills, Hoskote have a continued engagement and relationship of over 14 years.
- Career counselling, education counselling, special lectures by achievers, etc. –
 importance of education
- **Teachers' training** by expert organisations
- Connecting donors to institutions for infrastructure projects E.g. Toilet construction, rooms, painting, RO water facility, etc.
 - And few more....


Our Disaster relief activities

Summary Report of <u>Flood relief activity</u> @ Chennai, Kanchipuram and Tiruvallur districts $6^{th} - 7^{th} - 8^{th} December 2015$



- Covered > 40 sub locations, in 3 districts, impacting around 20,000 needy people, through direct 'face to face' delivery to the needy friends, in remote affected areas, not covered by other media/ NGOs.
- **Delivered** around 1lakh rotis, 40,000 water bottles, 1lakh biscuit packets, 500lts of milk, 40,000 jam & pickle sachet, and clothes/ blankets/ medicines/ utilities
- Perfect co-ordination and team work between >200 volunteers from both states (Kar and TN), and associating with like minded organizations like Sai Seva Samithi, Harmony Apts.
- Strong support from Corporates like Jones Lang LaSalle, Ingersoll Rand, Unilever, Vyoma Labs; educational institutions, and hundreds of individuals; in both cash and kind.
- Total expenditure of around INR 7 lakhs for phase 1

The following items are required for stage 1 support:

- Food items Rice (Matta rice), Pulses, Flour (Wheat, Maida, Rava, Rice), Green Gram, Salt, Edible Coconut Oil, Sugar, Tea Powder, Milk (good-life types): <u>Target:</u> <u>essentials each around 100 bags of 5 kg each</u>
- 2. Biscuits around 2 lakh+ packets (any size)
- 3. Water bottles preferably 1 litre bottles as much
- 4. Blankets/ bed-sheets/ dhotis/ Sarees etc. as much available (only New items allowed as per Collectorate orders) Target around 1000 each


